As we start the New Year we will be focusing on ensuring our pupils are ready and equipped to learn.

We have not made any changes to the uniform policy, viewable here, however, we would like to take the opportunity to just refresh parents and pupils on some of the expectations. Key areas to highlight are as follows:

- Hoodies are NOT allowed in school unless students are wearing a PE hoodie for PE lessons. If a pupil wishes to wear a jumper under their blazer, this must be a grey Vneck St. Sampson's jumper. If your child travels to school in a hoodie this must be in their bag before they enter the building in the morning and not removed until the end of the day.
- Piercings The only piercing allowed is a pair of plain studs in the ears, NO other piercings are allowed. If your child has additional piercings, they need to practise removing these so they are able to remove them for our return to school in January.
- Shirts and Ties All pupils are expected to wear shirts and ties, pupils need to ensure they can do their top button up so they can wear their tie correctly. Please ensure your child can do this before returning to school.

As we return at the height of winter is it vitally important that pupils have an appropriate waterproof coat. Pupils will not be allowed to wear any hoodies so their coat is a vital part of the SSHS uniform for when they are outside at break and lunch.

Equipment - All pupils need to attend with basic equipment: pen, pencil, ruler and planner (provided by school). They may also need specialised equipment for certain lessons.

The current house totals are very * close with only 800 points between Brecqhou in first place and Jethou in third place!



In the best of Elf St Sampson's High School performed Elf Jr - The Musical last week. Shaun Shackleton caught up with the actors, singers, director and producer between a three-night run of full houses

IT WAS a cast and crew of many. 'From Year 7 to Year 11 we had 40 in the cast and 40 in the choir, as well as dancers, so that's more than 80 all together, not counting the crew,' explained producer and musical co-director Sarah Tennant. She said it had been a 'real whirlwind' to put together. 'We've done it all in eight weeks. We came back to school in September, had workshop sessions and then we auditioned the cast. We chose Michael Riseborough, who goes to Le Murier School, to play Buddy.' The show is a huge achievement.

'We've had students as tech crew and stage crew, some who have made costumes, we have two dance captains and others doing the makeup. 'We've also had teachers, Mrs Birch and Mrs Tyne, in

charge of the props.' Alongside the three sell-out evenings, there was also what Sarah called a 'community performance'. 'That was on Monday and our first performance. It was in front of Le Murier School, Year 6 from Hautes Capelles Primary School and 50 students from St Sampson's who had decided to spend their merits on tickets.'

Owen Hassall, 15, took on an important role. 'Walter Hobbs, Buddy's father. He can't believe that Buddy is his son.' Owen auditioned for both Walter and Buddy. 'I've seen the film, as well as clips of the theatre show. I try to be as mean as possible. Then I have a change of heart. I've done a bit of acting at St Sampson's. I enjoy it. It's been fun but quite challenging.' Annie Setters is in the chorus

'I do singing at school and I used to sing out of school too,' said the 15-year-old. 'There are some quite good songs in Elf. they're very catchy."

12-year-old Alissa Kharroubi plays Matthews. 'He's an office person and quite serious about stuff. He thinks Buddy is funny to watch and very silly. He's fun to play. Alissa has had a great time being part of the play. 'The best thing about it is I've made loads of friends.' Gemma Bailey is a member of the tech crew. 'It was my first time,' said the 14-year-old. 'I didn't audition, I signed up. I do the projectors.' There is a large screen onstage and onto it is projected interactive scenes from the North Pole. New York and Macy's Department Store among others.

'We've had a bit of trouble with the radio mics, but we' solved the problem.' Gemma has also made new friends through being in the play, 'Some people I've known, but I'd never interacted with them until the after-show.' Sandra Rimmer is the show's director, 'I've done a lot of productions over the years,' she said. 'Performing as well as directing.' Originally teaching in Liverpool, Sandra began her Guernsey career as a supply teacher at Les Beaucamps. She is now St Sampson's High School's head of drama. 'We wanted something Christmassy and got a shortlist together but we all decided on Elf. 'We wanted it to be a team effort with plenty of team spirit. Even if a student wasn't performing we wanted to create opportunities for them to do other things. 'Putting on a production like this is wonderful. It helps with the students' confidence and communication skills.' And it's also a great show. 'It's a Christmas classic,' said Sarah.









