It has been a fantastic first term and we look forward to seeing more of their plans and ideas coming to life. If you have any suggestions, please talk to them! They are here to help.





Slipping beneath the ground, the tunnels twisted and ran; they led to darkness, dampness, decay. When the slow, dripping water fell on the blood-stained floor, its echoes whisper wearily. If the ancient beds creak, a ghost lurks nearby like a black cat around a witch. Disgustingly, the walls were slime; they watched you. Suddenly, a silent silhouette stood in the shadows and the dim glow flickered like a candle. Dull, dreary, dangerous: the passage seems never ending.
