There are now a total of five bands taking advantage of band coaching after school on a Tuesday and Wednesday. We are looking forward to showcasing them all in the summer term.


















Anyone is welcome to attend any club. From basketball shooting in the mornings before tutor time to choir. There is so much going on, take your pick!





Our 'Gache Melee' and 'Bean Jar' Bronze groups have been learning how to cook using the trangia stoves.



















Y10 students have been busy learning to make desserts: cookies, fruit pies and a trifle were just some of the delicacies that they created.












## IT/BUSINESS DEPARTMENT

#### MONEY MATTERS

SSHS is incredible proud to be part of "Money Matters". This is a scheme run by Island Radio and HSBC. The focus of this initiative is develop financial understanding and awareness. The scheme had hundreds of enquiries and applications. SSHS has been chosen from these applications. March 12th 2025 - HSBC will be delivering financial workshops to approximately 60 Y10 Business Studies pupils. These sessions will give the pupils an opportunity to develop their financial management skills.

This scheme will be rolled out across other year groups in the future.

#### PROJECT RETAIL

Ten Year 9 pupils are involved in a retail project organised by the COOP. They have already attended one session at the Head Office and completed a range of activities including taste testing. On Monday, 17th February, they attended a second session where they worked in a store setting. The sessions are designed to give the pupils an understanding of the retail sector, which employs 12.5% of the workforce. In May 2025, the pupils will be presenting to the board of trustees for Coop Channel Islands.







## **DESIGN AN AD**

On behalf of the Guernsey Press, SSHS pupils have been invited to participate in the 'Design an Ad' Competition for 2025. Pupils will be supplied with advertising briefs and they will design an advert, along with a list of sponsors and their logos.

This initiative continues to be recognised by schools and businesses as a practical and exciting opportunity for students to express their creative talent.




