A Year of Achievements and Memories!

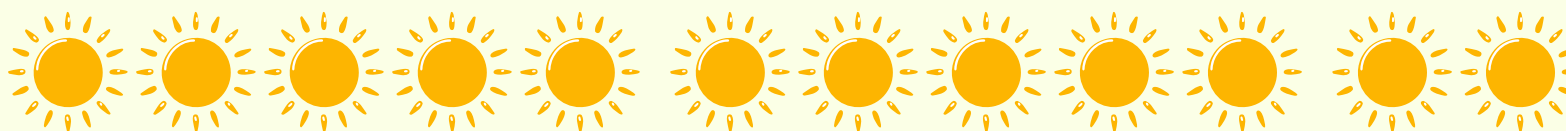

Our Skills for Life Group visited Grow Limited. They learnt about the history of the business, how the site is run and what they offer in respect of work experience.

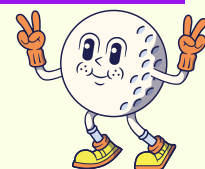
The students were also shown what was grown in the different greenhouses, things that are made to sell in the shop, things made from recycled wood for use on site or to sell, the restaurant and the chickens.

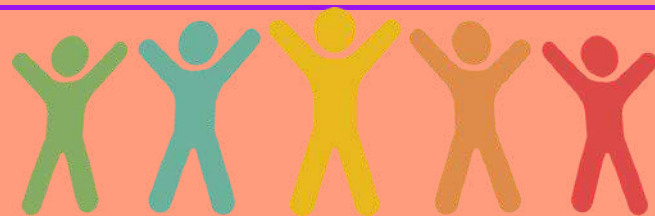


ARDECHE TRIP

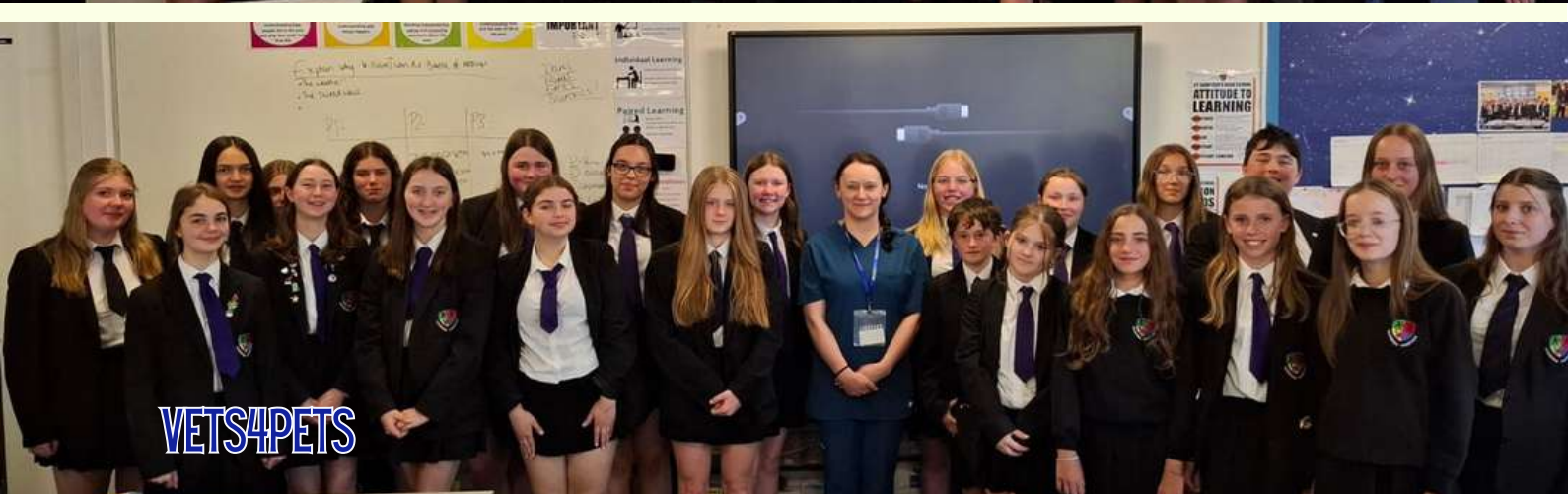


ASPIRATIONS

As you know, we are passionate about children's rights and we continuously look for ways to improve our school so that all children can access their rights. We have been looking at safety – UNCRC Article 19, as well as a healthy environment – Article 24 to help to protect students and support them through Active Travel when coming and going from our school every day.

You may ask yourself "why does anything need to change?"

As a school, we promote walking and cycling as a healthy way for everyone to travel to school. Research shows being active can help students concentrate better and increase their levels of achievement. Being active on their journey to school also helps young people reach the recommended 60 minutes of physical activity a day.

By walking or cycling, our school community can also help reduce the number of vehicles on the road, making it safer for pedestrians and cyclists. It also reduces the pollution caused from exhaust fumes, helping to combat climate change and create clearer air.

Here are some things we noticed about road safety and the road environment near to school:

- Several of the roads in the area approaching the school do not have footpaths.
- More of us would walk or cycle if it was safer.
- We are an active school, keen to travel actively in our beautiful environment.
- Fewer cars = better air quality = our right to a healthy environment (Article 24).

So, what have we done about it?

We met with Traffic and Highway Services and the Health Improvement Commission to explain that we wanted to improve the journey to school for our students. They said that although many of the roads immediately around school are well designed to get everyone to school safely, La Vieille Rue could easily be used as a School Street, which would improve safety in the road for those choosing to use active travel methods.

Dear Parents and Carers,

As Principals of the three 11-16 schools, we would like to take the opportunity to remind all families across the Secondary School Partnership of our existing mobile phone policy, designed to support student wellbeing and maintain a safe, calm, focused learning environment.

We would like to make clear that **smartphones are not required for any aspect of study in school**. All necessary digital tools and resources are provided through school-managed devices and platforms. For this reason, we would **prefer that students do not bring smartphones into school at all**.

However, if a student does bring a mobile phone to school, it must be kept **"Off and Away"** – switched off and **secured in their bag or locker** throughout the school day, including break and lunch times. This applies to all students unless a member of staff has given explicit permission for educational use in a supervised setting.

If a mobile phone is **seen or used during the school day without permission**, it will be **confiscated until the end of the day**, and **sanctions will be applied in line with the school's behaviour policy**.

This policy will be **consistently enforced across all schools** in the partnership. It is part of our wider commitment to supporting students' mental health, reducing harmful screen time, and encouraging positive social interaction during the school day.

We appreciate your support in reinforcing this message at home. By working together, we can ensure that our schools remain safe, respectful, and focused places for learning and personal development.

If you have any questions or concerns about this policy, please do not hesitate to contact your child's school directly.

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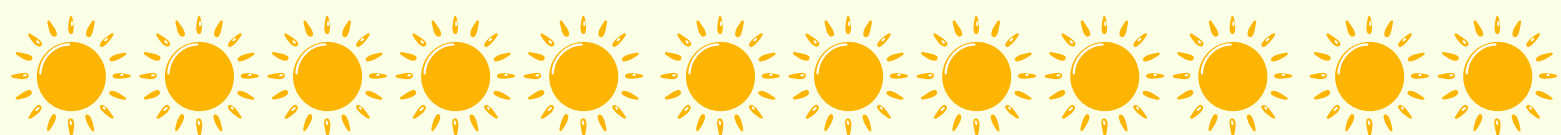
